

FIRST THINGS TO DO AFTER ARRIVAL

1.Settle in Your Dormitory

Location: Dorm "Maćko" Piątkowska 94/3c street.

2. Visit the International Office

Location: Wojska Polskiego 28 street (Collegium Max.). Room 209: Admission office: show original copies of your documents. International Student Support will book your appointment for PESEL number in city hall to proceed with further procedures.

3. Visit your Dean's office

Get Your Student ID (Legitymacja studencka) and clarify deatils regarding your course.

4. Arrange Health Insurance

Make sure that you have valid health insurance (European Health Insurance Card – EHIC for EU students, or private/Polish insurance for non-EU).

PULS International Students Support will guide you.

5. Register for Public Transport Card (Karta miejska) www.ztm.poznan.pl/wszystko-o-peka/els-i-inne-karty-w-systemie-peka/

6. Open a Polish Bank Account (or other EU-based bank)Bring passport, student certificate, and address confirmation to the bank.

7. Explore the Campus & City

Find your faculty (wydział), library, canteen, and study spaces. Get to know Centrum (city center) and main transport spots (like Słowiańska tram stop near dormitory).

Your legal stay in Poland is the most important. Once you have a PESEL number, insurance, and a bank account, the Student Support Office will help you apply for a Temporary Residence Card.

SCHOOL FACILITIES



ACADEMIC & RESEARCH INFRASTRUCTURE

The university comprises 41 buildings, featuring modern laboratories, research centres, and lecture halls equipped with advanced technologies for both teaching and research.

Key specialized facilities include Biocentre: A cutting-edge "E"-shaped complex with a 400-seat convertible auditorium, educational wings, and adjacent greenhouses used for plant research and practical classes.

University Veterinary Medicine Centre, Metabolism Research Lab, Behavioural Economics Lab, DRONELAB, KOMPLAB, 3D printing workshop, Pilot Biotechnology Station, and Innovation & Technology Transfer Centre support various strategic scientific initiatives.



LIBRARIES & INFORMATION RESOURCES

The Main Library and Scientific Information Centre offers extensive printed and digital collections, serving students and researchers alike.

It holds one of Poland's largest agriculturalfocused collections and provides access to 21 digital databases and an in-house AGRO database, facilitating cutting-edge academic research.



STUDENT HOUSING & SUPPORTIVE SERVICES

The campus includes 9 well-maintained dormitories, such as Jurand, Danuśka, Maćko, Przylesie, and the Sadyba Residence, offering single and shared rooms, kitchens, recreation zones, Wi-Fi, and amenities like medical clinics and nurseries (Sadyba area).

Dorm locations are conveniently close to campus and city transportation routes.

There is a cafeteria next to the rectorate building.

Each room is furnished and equipped with a refrigerator. The bathroom includes showers, sinks, and toilets. Our dormitories also have laundry rooms, drying rooms, study rooms, and meeting rooms. The complex also features barbecue areas, basketball, volleyball, and tennis courts, as well as bicycle shelters.

Access by public transport: by tram to the PST Słowiańska stop or by bus to the Koronna or Słowiańska stop. Detailed timetables can be found on the website of the Poznań Municipal Transport Authority https://ztm.poznan.pl/.

SPORTS, CULTURE & RECREATION

The Physical Culture Center (CKF) organizes physical education classes and promotes sports activities among students. Mandatory sports classes take place during the first year of studies for two semesters – the first semester ends with a pass, while the second semester includes a graded evaluation. Group registration is conducted at the beginning of the academic year, with detailed information available on the CKF website and bulletin boards near the dean's offices

The center offers a wide range of activities: team sports, gym workouts, aerobics, spinning, swimming lessons, tennis, horse riding, and Nordic walking. Students with health limitations can participate in rehabilitation classes.

CKF sports infrastructure includes:

- A Sports Hall with a team sports court, gym, aerobics rooms, table tennis, and spinning facilities,
- Tennis courts indoor and outdoor, a beach volleyball court,
- Additional facilities a rented swimming pool (KS Olimpia) and the equestrian center in Swadzim.

CKF collaborates with the University Sports Association (AZS Club), which organizes training sessions and enables participation in sports competitions, such as the Academic Championships of Greater Poland and Poland. The club offers numerous sports sections, including volleyball, basketball, swimming, athletics, mountain biking, tennis, and karate. Students can also compete in disciplines such as sailing, bowling, climbing, and squash. Scholarships are awarded for outstanding sports achievements. For students of all years, CKF also organizes optional (paid) activities,

POZNAŃ-TRADITION MEETS MODERNITY

In Poznań, a must-see is the Old Market Square, one of the most beautiful in Poland, with its Renaissance Town Hall and the famous mechanical goats. Just nearby, Ostrów Tumski (Cathedral Island) takes you back to the roots of the Polish state. The city surprises by blending over a thousand years of history with modern architecture, lively student culture, and business energy.





During the year, Poznań vibrates with life – cafés and bars open their gardens, festivals and concerts fill the streets, and international fairs attract visitors from all over the world. Students enjoy the green spaces of Citadel Park and the recreational area around Lake Malta, where you can cycle, sail, or even ski.

Poznań is a city of students - over 110,000 young people study here, creating an open and international atmosphere. Located halfway between Berlin and Warsaw, Poznań is easy to reach by train or plane. Affordable living costs, excellent public transport, and countless cultural events make Poznań one of the most student-friendly cities in Poland.





HOW TO GET TO POZNAŃ CITY CENTRE FROM THE CHOPIN AIRP OR POZNAŃ ŁAWICA AIRP?

From Warsaw Chopin Airport (WAW)

By Train: Take the airport train (\$2 or \$3) to Warszawa Centralna railway station (~20 minutes). From there, trains to Poznań Główny run frequently (approx. every 30–60 min). The journey takes about 3 hours. Buy ticket in mobile app: Koleo or in Ticket office open 24/7.

By Bus: FlixBus and other operators run direct services from Warsaw to Poznań (4.5–5 h).

By Plane: There are also domestic flights from Warsaw to Poznań Ławica Airport (~1 h).



From Poznań Ławica Airport (POZ)

By Bus: Bus line 159 runs from the airport directly to Poznań Główny railway station in ~20–25 minutes. Night bus 242 also connects the airport with the city centre.

Use mobile app "Jakdojade" to check schedule, localization of bus stop and buy ticket!

By Taxi/Uber/Bolt: 15-20 minutes to the city centre, approx. 40-60 PLN.

The airport is 7 km from the centre (around 15 minutes drive).

If your accommodation is our dormitory, use address: Piątkowska 94/3 (DS UPP).



Temporary Residence Permit (TRC) for Full-time Studies in Poznań Who needs to apply?

If you plan to stay in Poland for more than 3 months to pursue full-time studies at a higher education institution, you should apply for a temporary residence permit for study purposes.

You must apply before your current legal status expires (e.g. visa or residence card).

If you apply before your current status expires, you can legally stay in Poland while your application is pending - as long as your application is error-free and your passport is valid.

How to apply?

- 1. Go to the MOS website and create an account.
- 2. Read the instructions and review typical mistakes.
- 3. Complete the online application form.
- 4. Provide your email address once your application is registered by the office, you'll receive an access code to track your case status.
- 5. Print the completed form, sign it.
- 6. Send the printed form and required attachments by post to the Department for Foreigners in Poznań or another regional office. You can also go to the Office personally without a pre-booked appointment.
- 7. Make sure to submit by the last day of your legal stay in Poland. If using Polish Post, the date of posting is considered the submission date.

The next step is an in-person appointment for fingerprinting. During this visit, you'll complete formalities and receive a passport stamp.

To apply for TRC we offer you to meet with International Student Support (room 209), who will guide you through all procedures and will fill out the application in Polish.

Temporary Residence Permit (TRC) for Full-time Studies in Poznań Required documents

To open an application (formal steps):

- The signed application form (online + paper copy)
- 4 photographs
- A photocopy of a valid travel document (and original for inspection)
- Proof of payment of the required stamp duty

To be granted the temporary residence permit:

a) First-year students

- Certificate from your university, signed by the rector or an authorized person
- If you're continuing your studies: an authorized copy of the evaluation card
- Proof of tuition fee payment for your academic year, or proof of exemption
- Proof of health insurance valid in Poland
- Proof of sufficient financial resources to cover living costs in Poland for 15 months (the minimum amount is 1010 PLN for each month of your stay + the cost of your return travel to your country of origin (2500 PLN) + the cost of your tuition for each month of your stay + housing costs)
- A declaration regarding housing costs (unless you're a citizen of Belarus)

b) Students in subsequent years

- Certificate from university
- Authorized copies of your evaluation card
- Proof of tuition fee payment or fee exemption
- Health insurance
- Proof of sufficient financial resources for your period of stay (with maximum duration up to 3 years)

Stamp duty:

It is a payment for submitting an application, for granting the permit and other official activities. The amount of fees is specified by law on 340 PLN.

There is an extra payment required for issuing the <u>residence card</u>. The amount will be specified in the instruction of the <u>decision</u> for a residence permit (100PLN).



Temporary Residence Permit (TRC) for Full-time Studies in Poznań After the decision

Once your residence permit is granted:

- You can work in Poland without a separate work permit.
- You are obliged to inform the Governor's Office that issued your permit within 15 business days if the reason for permit issuance ceases - for example, if you are removed from the student list, resign from studies, or change universities.

Tips

- Submit your application early (before your visa or current status expires).
- Make sure your application is complete and error-free incomplete or incorrect applications may delay processing.
- Track your case online using the access code you received by email.
- Keep your passport valid during the application process.

Documents Required:

- Passport or national ID
- confirmation of student status from dean's office
- confirmation from dormitory
- PESEL number (if you have one, but it's not required)
- Completed NFZ insurance application form from student support office

Cost: ~56 PLN per month

Once you sign the agreement, you will receive a document confirming your NFZ registration.

Then, Register the Agreement with ZUS (Social Insurance Institution)

Documents Required:

- Copy of the NFZ insurance agreement
- ZUS ZZA form available at ZUS
- Passport or ID

You need to submit the ZUS ZZA form to register for social security. Once you are registered, you can visit any public healthcare facility (Przychodnia or Szpital) that works with NFZ. You will need to show your passport or student ID and provide your NFZ registration number.

Emergency? Call 112 for an ambulance or visit the nearest hospital emergency room (SOR – Szpitalny Oddział Ratunkowy).


In case if you obtain private health insurance, like PZU or Wiener, you should contact with insurance call center or number provided on your contract in order to book doctor appointment.

In case of mid-emergency there is evening and night family doctor shift, available for everyone with gov (NFZ) insurance:

Patients can use night and holiday healthcare services primarily in the event of sudden illness or sudden deterioration of health, when there are no symptoms suggesting an immediate threat to life. BEGINNING OF STUDIES



Student Card and student number: each student who arrives at PULS, registers and starts studies will receive a plastic Student Card at the Dean's Office of the Faculty. A Student Card is green, includes the name of PULS, your data and photo, and it proves that you are officially a student in Poland. The backside of the card has a place for tiny stickers that mark the card's validity. The stickers will be given to you at the beginning of each semester by the Dean's Office of your Faculty. The Student Card will also include your student number (in Polish: "numer albumu") consisting of 6 digits. You should memorize this number as it will be the main way to identify you in almost all PULS databases. This card is used at the university as your library card and in other situations, so you should always have it.

THE STUDENT CARD ENTITLES TO DISCOUNTS ON SOME OF THE PUBLIC SERVICES IN POLAND, FOR EXAMPLE, ON PUBLIC TRANSPORT:

- PUBLIC TRANSPORT IN POZNAN ("ZTM") 50% DISCOUNT ON ALL BUSES, TRAMS;
- TRAINS ("PKP") 51% DISCOUNT FOR MOST OF THE TICKETS IF YOU ARE LESS THAN 26 YEARS OLD;

To be able to use the discounts on transport or other services, you need to always carry the Student Card with you.

How many times can you not come to class?

Depending on the course of study, up to 20%. Remember to inform your lecturer about your future absence. If you are sick, go to the doctor and ask for hard copy confirmation.

What can I do in case of financial crisis? →GRANT

"Zapomoga" / "Social money". The allowance is a one-off financial support that can be received by a student who finds himself in a temporarily difficult life situation.

-You can receive the allowance a maximum twice per academic year.

-The application should be submitted to the Faculty Scholarship Committee.

The trip is subsidized by a scholarship, depending on the location of the trip; however, this subsidy will not fully cover all the costs of the stay - so be prepared for some spendings.


The criteria for qualification are knowledge of a foreign language (English or German), grade point average and additional activities (active participation in the study circle, local government or serving as the year representative).

To the north we are adjacent to a cool temperate climate type. In contrast, Europe's south is dominated by a warm Mediterranean climate.

How do I find help if I lose my wallet or passport?


You should report it directly in the closest one police station.


